JMG students seeking proposals

LINCOLN — Northern Penobscot Tech/Region III's Jobs for Maine Graduates students are again seeking proposals from non-profit groups.

For a fourth year, the JMG students are participating in the Jumpstart Our Youth (JOY) program, a philanthropic effort sponsored by the Unity Foundation, the Maine Community Foundation and Uni-Tel Inc.

The JMG students are awarded \$1,000 from the sponsors and will determine which organizations will receive the money, which can be given to more than one group. Also, the students are looking to

raise another \$1,000 to supplement the grant.

Groups looking to benefit youth in northern Penobscot County can submit their ideas by Jan. 27, 2012 using JOY's online application form, located at www.jumpstartouryouth.org.

First, click on the "JMG/Joy Application" link, located under a map of Maine on the home page.

Next, applicants will have to log in using the following JOY ID (youth2012) and password (aim-high12), which are case sensitive. Once those are filled in, the application form appears.

In the first field, *JMG Site, a

dropdown menu will appear and applicants should select the "N. Penobscot Applied Tech (JMG-039) (003 North), then fill out the required fields, which have an asterisk before them.

There are no word count limitations, but applications must be completed in one session, since the form has no save or edit features. Once all the fields are filled out, click the "Submit" button, at which point the submission becomes final.
